



























## KNOW THE RULES ENVIRONMENTAL LAWS IN INDIA

## **Constitutional Provisions:**

- **1. Article 48A:** Directive Principles of State Policy The State shall endeavor to protect and improve the environment and safeguard the country's forests and wildlife
- **2. Article 51A(g):** Fundamental Duties It shall be the duty of every citizen of India to protect and improve the natural environment including forests, lakes, rivers, and wildlife, and to have compassion for living creatures.

## **MAJOR ENVIRONMENTAL LAWS:**

S. NO	ENVIRONMENT LAW	DESCRIPTION OF LAW
1.	The Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1974	Establishes Pollution Control Boards at the Central and State levels to monitor and control water pollution
2.	The Air (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1981	Establishes measures to control air pollution and assigns responsibility to Pollution Control Boards
3.	The Environment (Protection) Act, 1986	Provides a framework for the protection and improvement of the environment
4.	The Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980	Aims to conserve forests and regulate the diversion of forest land for non-forest purposes.
5.	The Wildlife Protection Act, 1972	Provides the protection of wild animals, birds, and plants. Establishes protected areas such as national parks and wildlife sanctuaries.
6.	The Energy Conservation Act, 2001	Promotes energy efficiency and conservation, establishing the Bureau of Energy Efficiency to implement measures for reducing energy consumption including PAT schemes
7.	The National Green Tribunal Act, 2010	Establishes the National Green Tribunal (NGT) for the effective and expeditious disposal of cases relating to environmental protection of forests.

## **MAJOR ENVIRONMENTAL RULES & REGULATIONS**

S. NO	ENVIRONMENT RULES	DESCRIPTION OF RULES
1.	The Hazardous and Other Wastes (Management and Transboundary Movement) Rules, 2016 (9th Amendment in 2024)	Governs the management and handling of hazardous and other wastes and its transboundary movement
2.	The Biomedical Waste Management Rules, 2016 (3 <sup>rd</sup> Amendment in 2019)	Regulates the proper management and disposal of biomedical waste
3.	The E-Waste (Management) Rules, 2016 (3 <sup>rd</sup> Amendment in 2024)	Specifies the responsibilities of producers and consumers for the management of electronic waste
4.	The Plastic Waste Management Rules, 2016 (2 <sup>nd</sup> Amendment in 2022)	Focuses on managing plastic waste through recycling and reducing plastic use through EPR
5.	The Construction and Demolition Waste Management Rules, 2016	Provides guidelines for the proper management and disposal of construction and demolition waste
6.	The Solid Waste Management Rules, 2016	Establishes procedures for managing solid waste generated by municipalities and other local bodies
7.	The Coastal Regulation Zone (CRZ) Notification, 2019	Regulates activities in coastal areas to protect/conserve the coastal environment
8.	The Ozone Depleting Substances (Regulation and Control) Rules, 2000	Regulates production, use, and disposal of substances that deplete the ozone layer
9.	The Batteries (Management and Handling) Rules, 2001	Governs the management and handling of lead-acid batteries & other batteries
10.	The Fly Ash Utilization Notification, 1999	Promotes the utilization of fly ash generated by thermal power plants
11.	The Noise Pollution (Regulation and Control) Rules, 2000	Regulates and controls noise pollution
12.	The Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Rules, 2017	Provides for the conservation and management of wetlands
13.	The Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Notification, 2006	Mandates prior environmental clearance for certain projects and activities
